F.A.I.T.H. Homes of Donegal

FAITH Homes has had three cottages in Mount Joy for families who are in need of temporary housing. Each family is also provided with a mentor who helps them to obtain permanent housing, jobs, counselling. **There will soon be a fourth house**. It has been purchased and repairs and renovations are being done.

At present they are in need of mattresses in all sizes, air conditioners and fans. A request was also made for bunk beds. On the other hand, there is a Craftmatic adjustable bed in the furniture bank for anyone who needs it.

There are brochures in the Fellowship Hall and Second Chances announcing a "rewards card" for the "Park City Diner" and "Knight and Day Diner" (formerly the Airport Diner). When a cardholder eats at either diner and presents their card to the cashier, the restaurant will donate 10% of their meal purchase to Faith Homes of Donegal. It can be used multiple times.
